POSITION DESCRIPTION:

The Community Healing Project is a City of Toronto project delivered in partnership with community organizations including Stella's Place. The project focuses on building the mental health literacy of youth with lived experiences of community violence exposure and other roots of youth violence between the ages 12-29 from across the City of Toronto.

The Manager, Community Healing Project will work closely with the Community Healing Project team, partnering agencies, relevant systems, and other youth serving/community agencies to support all aspects of the project.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Leads the on-going development of overall project plan including the establishment of timelines, roles, responsibilities, procedures and operating budgets
- Recruitment, supervision, and support of project staff in partnership with project partners and the City of Toronto- Determines project/workshop sites in partnership with project team and partners
- Works in collaboration with Peer Support Training Manager to determine training content and sessions to ensure alignment with project, healers, and community needs
- Determines and co-facilitation of training sessions, as needed
- Leads the development and facilitation of Community of Practice sessions with the support of project staff
- The Program Manager will work with Community Development Officer and Quadrant leads for the selection of communities for the upcoming year.



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- Supervises the project Case Manager and provides management support to them:
- Supports the development and deliverables of Community Healing Project Peer Mentors

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• Supports program development and delivery with a focus on continuous improvement

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- Manages and responds to concerns related to risk or safety, including crisis prevention and intervention within an in-person, phone, and virtual setting
- Works collaboratively with project team and Quadrant Lead agencies to develop and maintain community stakeholder relationships, establish referral partners, and respond to community-specific needs
- Maintains and establishes ongoing partnerships with contracted counsellors for services provided to project participants
- Ensures project team supports data collection and evaluation of workshops
- Provides on-the-ground support, as required, for workshops and giveback days
- Supports the planning and delivery of community giveback days and projects
- Leads Community Healing Project graduation planning and delivery

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Diploma or Degree in a related field (Child/Youth Work, Social Work, Community Development, etc.) or 7+ years equivalent experience
- Strong interpersonal and relationship building skills Ability to establish rapport and excellent communication with youth and young adults, families, community partners, staff, etc.
- Experience supervising and coaching community-based workers in the youth sector
- Experience providing holistic supports to youth vulnerable to serious violence and crime
- Experience working within a virtual workshop/training setting
- Familiarity and comfort with virtual support and services
- Grant management, budget, partnership delivery, client-focus, data collection and analysis; continuous improvement and flexibility
- Demonstrated knowledge and understanding of programs and services available to youth and young adults in the City of Toronto
